

- Poultry Exhibit entries must be in before 5:00pm Wednesday 11 February 2026.
- Unfortunately, we cannot accept late entries.

Exhibits – when do I need to have the Pavilion exhibits at the Showground?

- You need to ensure that your exhibits are present at the Cobargo Showground by no later than **11:00am Friday 13 February 2026.**
- Judging is at 1:00pm on Friday 13 February 2026.
- You may drop your exhibits to Cobargo Showground from Sunday 8 February 2026. We encourage you to drop your non-perishable items to the Showground early, to allow us more time to prepare. Please note, the Society does not accept any responsibility for your exhibits whilst at the Cobargo Showground.

- Sunday 9:00am 3:00pm

Rules you need to know

- A Junior is an exhibitor 17 years of age and under, unless stated otherwise.
- A Novice is a person who has never won a First Prize with the type of exhibit he/she is staging in any Agricultural Society Show.
- Exhibitors may sell exhibits outside the Pavilion after 4.00pm on the final day of the show.
- Animal drug testing may be carried out at this show. Any competitor, exhibitor, owner found to have breached the ASC Disputes and Disciplinary Regulations will be investigated by the ASC Disciplinary Committee and dealt with accordingly.

When can I collect my exhibits?

You can collect your exhibits from 3:30pm (Quilts 4:30pm) Sunday 15 February 2026. We will be closing the pavilion at 3:00pm on Sunday with access allowed by stewards only. It will reopen at 3:30pm for collection of exhibits.

You will need to collect all pavilion and cattle prize money within 30 days of the show. Money can be collected from the Secretary's window after 9:00am Sunday 15 February 2026.

Poultry Exhibitors – New Location

All Poultry Exhibitors are required to have poultry caged 8:30am Sunday 15 February 2026. Poultry shed is in old dining Hall (behind the Pavilion on hill)





The following recipe is compulsory for all entrants.

RICH FRUIT CAKE - Here's what you need:

250g (8 oz) Sultanas

250g (8 oz) Chopped raisins

250g (8 oz) Currants

125g (4 oz) Chopped mixed peel

90g (3 oz) Chopped red glace cherries

90g (3 oz) Chopped blanched almonds

1/3 Cup sherry or brandy

250g (8 oz) Plain flour

60g (2 oz) Self raising flour

1/4 teaspoon Grated nutmeg

1/2 teaspoon Ground Ginger

1/2 teaspoon Ground cloves

250g (8 oz) Butter

250g (8 oz) Soft brown sugar

1/2 teaspoon Lemon essence OR finely grated lemon rind

1/2 teaspoon Almond essence

1/2 teaspoon Vanilla essence

4 Large eggs





Here's what you do: -

Mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy. Cover and leave for at least 1 hour, but preferably overnight.

Sift together the flours and spices. Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences. Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, then alternately add the fruit and flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon.

Place the mixture into a prepared square tin 20 cm (8") and bake in a slow oven for approximately $3^{1}/_{2}$ - 4 hours. Allow the cake to cool in the tin.

NOTE: To ensure uniformity and depending upon the size it is suggested the raisins be snipped into 2 or 3 pieces; cherries into 4-6 pieces and almonds crosswise into 3-4 pieces.

Winners at Country Shows will each receive a cash prize of \$25 (in addition to the Prize-money offered by the local Society) and will be required to bake a second "Rich Fruit Cake" in order to compete in a semi-final to be conducted by each of the 14 Groups of the Agricultural Societies Council of NSW.

NOTE: COMPETITORS MAY ONLY REPRESENT ONE SHOW SOCIETY IN A GROUP FINAL AND ONLY ONE GROUP IN A STATE FINAL.

The fourteen winners at Regional Level will each receive a cash prize of \$50 and are required to bake a third "Rich Fruit Cake" for the Final Judging at the Royal Easter Show where the winner will receive cash prize of \$100. 
Before anything else – Read the schedule.

- Show cooking is very different to home cooking.
- All Entries to be placed on covered board or china plate ONLY.
- Paper plates/ cardboard/ Foam not permitted they WON'T win a prize.
- Exhibits need to be size appropriate to board/plate.
- Round cakes on round board, square cakes on square board etc.
- Loaf or bar tin should only be used for Orange cake/Date loaf.
- If your entry is not on a board/plate it WILL NOT be judged.
- Do not use toothpicks to hold bag away from exhibit.
- No cake rack marks on bottom of exhibit.
- Don not turn cakes upside down.
- Scones no flour on bottom brush if off after cooking.
- Slices uniform shape ie square & not too big *not like you get in a café.
- Icing refers to a plain icing with nothing else added, once you add a rind/nut
 etc it is then classed as a decorated cake & will disqualified in that class.
- Date loaf does not contain nuts/ginger.
- All Paper is to be removed from cooking your exhibit.
- Anzac biscuits have to snap in half.
- Pikelets have to bend without braking.

Some things the judge looks for.

- Fruit in fruit cakes should be even in size.
- Cake is cooked evenly, centre is cooked, not dry & no burning or cracking of the top/sides
- Cake has to taste like it's description eg orange has to taste orange etc.
- Slices/biscuits/pikelets to be all even & same size.

Cobargo AP & H Society - Snippets of history

HAVE YOU LOOKED ABOVE THE BAR AREA RECENTLY?

Each year, the Committee of the Cobargo AP&H Society strives to introduce something fresh for the community, while honouring the rich history and cherished traditions of our Show. In 2023, the focus turned to the district's iconic stock brands. Members searched through their sheds, uncovering old branding irons that had marked generations of local livestock. Embracing tradition, a fire pit was lit, and the irons were heated—just as it was done in days gone by. The distinctive symbols were then burned onto timber, creating a lasting tribute.

These brands are more than just marks; they represent the enduring legacy of longstanding families who have shaped the Show movement and the history of Cobargo itself.

So, you may ask, what's so great about a "STOCK BRAND"?

Well, heaps is our answer. They were not only a way of identifying an animal from ownership to sale or for breeding but also to track stock and disease. They document

HISTORY: The brand was often based on something of significance to the family or the property from which it came. It could have been an initial or a landform or some other special symbol.

HERITAGE: It identified the property on which the stock were bred or grown up. The Government registers hold these names.

BREEDING: If a family had several properties, then each property may have had a brand that was a variation of the original brand. Eg a large letter versus a smaller one, or a letter with a variation or addition to the symbol. The brand and documentation of the animal's pedigree could be used to ensure healthy breeding patterns.

SAFETY: They provided a way to track theft, lost animals, stock movement and disease by way of registration and sales records.

The brands had to be registered in the appropriate Government agency and Gazettes were published and updated regularly. There was a format for the symbols, and they had to be placed in specific areas dependant upon the type of animal.

For some local dairy cattle, it was on the animal's upper left hip and for beef cattle the lower left hip. There were several sites for horses with many on the upper right shoulder above the saddle area. Horse symbols represent birth year and initials of the breeder/owner.

Generally hot iron branding of stock ceased in this area over 30 years ago with the advent of freeze or cryo-branding and animal welfare concerns. But now the use of ear tags and electronic identification systems allow for easier stock tracing. The National Livestock Identification System (NLIS) ensures market access, traceability, food safety and biosecurity.

So, when you look above the bar, maybe spend a little time reflecting on those symbols.


What's the story behind that brand? Where was the property? Who were the families? How do they fit into our story?

(CUT FLOWERS, VEGETABLES, ETC)

The Judge may not correct any error but may direct the steward's attention to it.

ABBREVIATIONS

- A.N.S.: Any Number of Stems
- A.O.V.: Any Other Variety
- N.A.S.: Not According to Schedule
- CONTAINER: can be any shape and any material
- C.V.A.: Color Variation allowed
- CUT: a cut is a portion of the plant, with or without its laterals
- S.S.: Staged Singly
- VASE: is a vessel the height of which is greater than its width
- N.N.D.: Not Necessarily Distinct, the term means an exhibit need not consist of three different varieties. Opposite of Distinct.
- BOWL: is a vessel the inside diameter of which is greater than its outside depth

- CONDITION: is the state of freshness of the exhibit and its freedom from marks or damage
- DISTINCT: the term means different. If the Schedule says – three roses distinct then separate varieties must be staged.
- STALK: a stalk is the portion of the plant between the last pair of main leaves and the flower head
- STEM: a stem is any portion of a garden plant below the topmost pair of main leaves. It may be branched.
- NOVICE: is a person who has never won a first prize with the type of exhibit, he/she is staging in any agricultural show.
- In floral entries, exhibitors' tags should be placed behind the exhibit, as they can detract from the appearance.
- Foliage in a pot plant must be 'rounded' (i.e. an all-round effect ... not like a corner piece) as it is judged right around.

Exhibit = actual item being shown eg fruit, needlework

South Coast Outdoor Products

BY-LAWS AND REGULATIONS GENERAL

- These By-laws and Regulations apply to the Cobargo Agricultural, Pastoral
 and Horticultural Society Incorporated, known also as the Cobargo AP&H
 Society or the Cobargo Show Society, and in these By-laws and Regulations
 referred to as the "Society", which was incorporated in New South Wales
 on 3 September 1986 under the Associations Incorporation Act 1984 with
 the incorporation number Y0113519.
- The management committee of the Society as defined in clause 14 of the Society's Rules may make any decisions relating to the conducting of the annual show or any other show or function consistently with these By-laws and Regulations.
- All persons entering or remaining on any premises on which the Society is conducting a show or other function shall conform to these By-laws and Regulations.
- 4. The annual show shall be held at the showground in Cobargo on a day or days determined by the Society, normally the second Friday, Saturday and Sunday of February of each year. The Society may postpone or cancel the Show, either wholly or in part, in the event of inclement weather or for any reason, and the Society shall be under no liability or obligation to any person by reason of such postponement or cancellation, except that the Society may refund any entry fees to exhibitors.
- The Society reserves the right to cancel, postpone or reschedule any event or display for any reason, and all times displayed for events and displays shall be purely for guidance and liable to be altered to suit circumstances.
- All persons entering the showground shall pay the prescribed admission fee or shall show a members ticket or other pass authorised by the Society to the gate keeper at the time of entry.
- Any person behaving in an offensive or disturbing manner shall be liable to be removed from the showground.
- 8. All persons attending the show, whether as exhibitor, contestant or spectator, shall obey any notices or directions, whether given in writing or verbally, as to outdoor areas of the showground or the interiors of buildings which the Society has designated as having restricted access at all or at certain times.
- All persons shall keep clear of the sewage treatment plant located on the showground.
- 10. Any vehicles or implements which are brought onto the showground shall be driven, operated or parked only on designated roadways or parking areas, subject to any directions given by the Society or any person authorised to give such directions.
- 11. Any person wishing to camp on the showground, either during the day or overnight, shall on payment to the Society of the prescribed camping fee be permitted to use one of the electrical power outlets provided for this purpose, subject to any direction of the Society as to the siting of the vehicle to be so connected and the method of connection.
- 12. All electrical appliances and all electrical connections and wiring which are in use or proposed to be used on the showground are subject to inspection by the Society.
- 13. Battery powered energised electric fences shall be permitted in designated areas on the showground.
- 14. All animals of whatever sort which may be brought onto the showground, whether for the purpose of competing or otherwise, shall be kept under the control of a competent person at all times.
- 15. All dogs on the showground shall be kept on a leash at all times. Any dog which is found to be off leash shall be liable to be dealt with as a stray animal and removed from the showground by a Council ranger.
- 16. All persons competing in, whether for reward or otherwise, either alone or with an animal or animals, or entering or in any way taking part in any event shall indemnify the Society from any responsibility or liability for personal or property loss or injury incurred by any person as a result of the conducting of the event, by filling in and signing a Participant Risk Acknowledgement & Waiver.
- 17. Any person showing disrespect or using offensive language towards or interfering with the activities of any judge may be asked to leave the showground for a period of time determined by the Society.
- 18. The decision of a judge of any section or event shall be final, unless a protest is made in writing to the Secretary of the Society in the case of a section by 12 PM on the Saturday, or in the case of an event within one hour of the conclusion of the event, stating the reason or reasons for such protest, and accompanied by a fee of \$50, which fee shall be refunded to the person making the protest in the event of the protest being upheld. Any such protest shall be dealt with by the executive sub-committee, who may invite the person making the protest and any steward of the section or event concerned to attend any meeting of such sub-committee called to deal with the protest.
- 19. All exhibits entered in any section and all animals competing in any event shall be free of any marks or distinguishing features which may identify the exhibitor.
- 20. The Society is not registered for Goods and Services Tax (GST).

- 21. Any person entering an exhibit in a class or competing in an event which is restricted to a certain age or range of ages may be required to show evidence that he or she is qualified by age to enter such class or compete in such event. The age of such person shall be taken as the age on the first day of the show.
- 22. Any person eighteen years of age or over who is awarded prize money of over \$50 in total shall be required to provide the Society with an Australian Business Number (ABN) or else shall be required to complete a Statement by a supplier form, otherwise 48.5% of such prize money shall be deducted and remitted to the Australian Taxation Office.
- 23. Any prizes, prize money, prize certificates and ribbons which remain uncollected by or on behalf of an exhibitor within one month of the end of the show shall be forfeited.

PAVILION

- 24. Any person wishing to enter an exhibit into one or other section of the pavilion schedule shall fill out an entry form, including the accompanying *Competitor/Exhibitor Release*, which form shall be delivered to the Secretary of the Society by 5pm on the day before the first day of the show, or by such other time as may be specified for any particular section of the schedule. A copy of the entry form and an exhibit ticket shall then be given to the exhibitor, which exhibit ticket shall be attached to the exhibit before the delivery thereof to the pavilion.
- 25. Exhibits shall be delivered to the pavilion by 11.00 AM on the first day of the show or at such other time as may be specified for any particular section of the schedule.
- 26. The Society shall appoint stewards to assist with the presentation of the exhibits for judging and their subsequent displaying and to ensure as far as possible their security, but the Society shall not incur any liability for damage to or loss of exhibits however occasioned on such account.
- 27. The Society reserves the right to reclassify or reject any exhibit which is deemed not to be in accordance with the class nominated by the exhibitor or which is deemed to be diseased or of a hazardous or offensive nature or to be a noxious weed.
- 28. All exhibits shall be the *bona fide* work of the exhibitor whose name appears on the entry form.
- 29. No person with the exception of a judge, a steward or the Secretary or a member of the committee of the Society or a person authorised in writing by the Secretary shall enter the pavilion while the judging of the exhibits is in progress.
- 30. A judge may decline to award any prize of whatever sort, if he or she considers any or all exhibits in a particular class of any section not to be of sufficient standard. A judge may recommend for a special award or prize any exhibit which he or she considers worthy thereof.
- 31. No exhibit shall be removed from the pavilion before 3:30pm on the last day of the show.
- 32. Exhibitors or their nominees may, after the closing of the pavilion at 3pm on the last day of the show, enter the pavilion in an orderly manner to collect their exhibits, which they shall be entitled to remove only after showing a steward the duplicate copy of the entry form for the exhibit. Any exhibit not collected within twenty-four hours of the end of the show will be disposed of at the discretion of the Society.

CATTLE, HORSES, OTHER LIVESTOCK, & RING EVENTS

33. All persons exhibiting or competing or in any way taking part in any such events shall obey the conditions pertaining to such events as appearing in the respective schedules and programs.

SIDESHOWS AND INDUSTRIAL AND COMMERCIAL DISPLAYS AND EXHIBITIONS

- 34. Space on the showground may be rented to any person natural or otherwise on the basis of frontage at a rate determined by the Society.
- 35. The Society reserves the right to refuse any application by any such person for such space without giving any reason.
- 36. The Society reserves the right to allocate such space, but may delegate this right to a body approved by the Society.
- All rent for such space shall have been paid in full by such person as
 evidenced by a receipt before such person shall be allowed to enter
 the showground.

In these By-laws and Regulations, "section" means any of the sections identified by letters A to R of the show schedule, and "event" means any of the events, whether competitive or otherwise, conducted in the ring or elsewhere as part of the show.

The Society does not accept any responsibility for any printing errors occurring in this Schedule.
